# Healthcare Professionals' Critical Role

Connecting patients to the financial support they need

- **Often the first to spot cost barriers**, since patients raise affordability issues during care discussions
- **Serve as highly trusted guides:** patients more likely to pursue assistance resources when recommended by a care team member

# Health Insurance Premium Grants

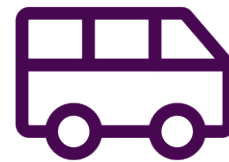
PAN's health insurance premium grants help pay for health insurance premiums for patients being treated for various disease states. Our health insurance premium grants offer funds to cover a portion of your premium costs.

## With a health insurance premium grant

- Your patient's grant covers the health insurance premium for an individual, or the individual's portion of a family plan
- PAN pays your patient's insurance company directly
- The amount of assistance the patient receives varies by disease fund



# Transportation Assistance Program



Many patients lack reliable transportation, leading to poor health and limited access to the care they need and deserve.

With a PAN transportation grant patients can receive \$500 to pay for transportation to and from activities that improve their overall health including:

- Grocery stores
- Medical appointments
- Pharmacies
- Social support, and more!

# Who is Eligible to Receive a PAN grant?

## Eligibility varies by disease fund and type of grant.

In general, to qualify for a PAN grant, your patient must meet these criteria:

- Be receiving treatment for the disease named in the disease fund
- Be prescribed a medication or product that is included on our list of covered products for that disease
- Have health insurance that covers their medication or product
  - **(Note:** *health insurance requirements vary by disease fund*)
- Have an income that falls at or below 400 or 500% of the Federal Poverty Level.
  - **(Note:** *income requirements vary by disease fund*)
- Reside and receive treatment in the United States or U.S. territories (citizenship is not required)

# About the PAN Foundation's Disease Funds

## Assistance amounts vary per disease fund

Our assistance amounts are designed to cover the average annual out-of-pocket treatment cost per each covered disease.

## Patients have a 12-month eligibility period

New patients receive a 3-month look back period.

## Patients - or their provider or pharmacy- must submit a claim every 120 days

We'll send a notification letter if we don't get a paid claim in 90 days. If we don't hear back from you on the 120th day, we'll release the funds to help others in need.

## Potential for renewal

Renewal applications accepted 1 month before eligibility period ends, subject to available funding.

## Potential for additional funding

You can apply for **additional funding** within the same initial 12-month grant eligibility period if you run out of funds and your balance is \$0, subject to availability of funding. Additional funding applies only to copay and health insurance premium grants.

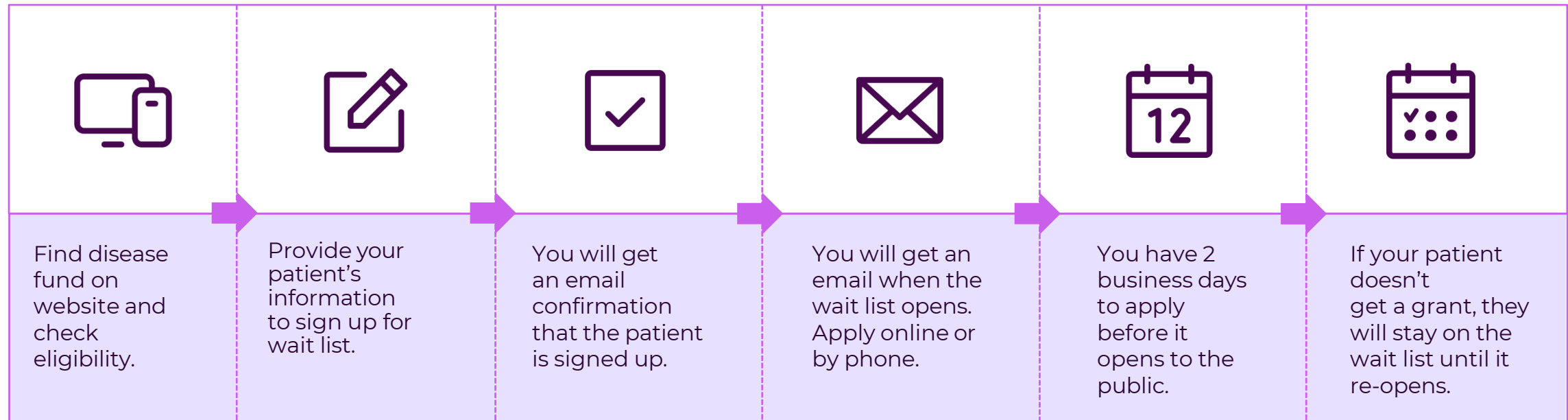
# Understanding funding status

The PAN Foundation relies on charitable donations to make our funds available to patients and works tirelessly to secure continued funding. Due to the nature of donation-based programs, our financial assistance programs close when funding is depleted. We open these programs as soon as new funding is received.



# How the Wait List Works

The wait list is a list of patients waiting to apply for financial assistance from a closed copay, health insurance premium, or transportation fund. Patients may add themselves to the wait list or be added by their provider, pharmacy, or caregiver.

# 1. Check if a fund is open

**There are three ways to check the status of PAN funds:**

2. Use a PAN portal account, **panfoundation.org/panportals**
3. Call us at **1-866-316-7263** (Monday through Friday, 9:00am – 5:30pm ET)



## 2. Verify your patient's eligibility

### Eligibility varies by disease fund and type of grant.

- Have health insurance that covers their medication or product  
(**Note:** *health insurance requirements vary by disease fund*)

(**Note:** *income requirements vary by disease fund*)
- Reside and receive treatment in the United States or U.S. territories (citizenship is not required)

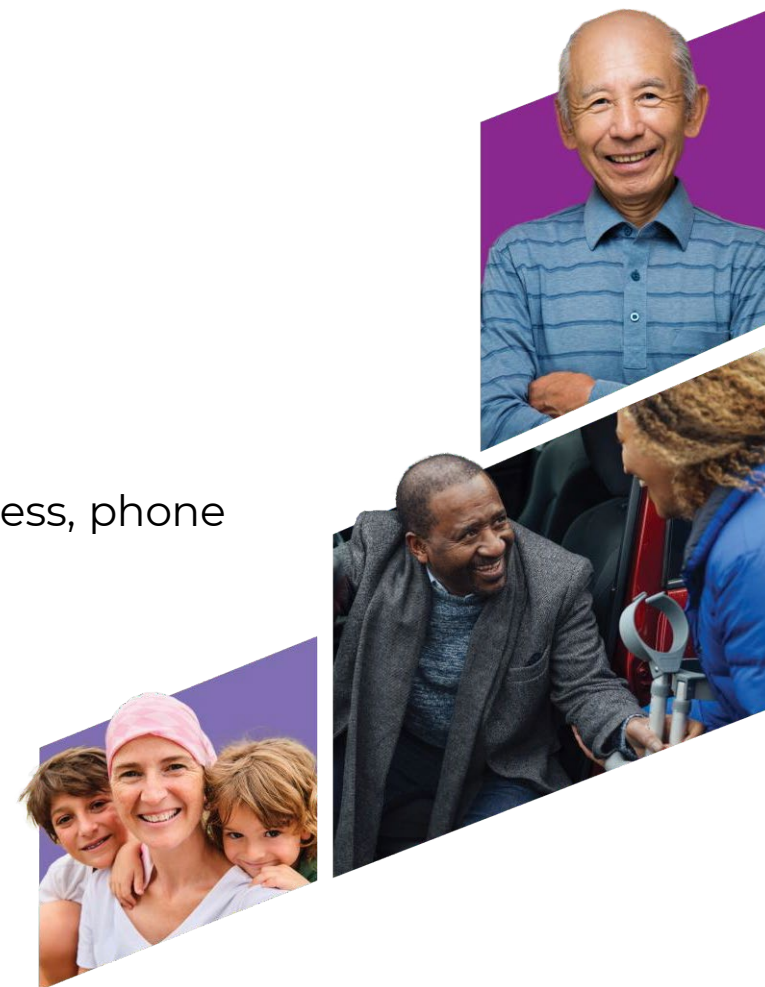

Pat or pharmacists can **check a patient's eligibility** for a disease fund and **begin the application process** right from the [panfoundation.org](https://panfoundation.org) homepage.

# 3. Gather all required information

## Be prepared with the following information:

- Patient's diagnosis and medication name(s)
- Patient's ICD-10 diagnosis code(s)  
(**Note:** a list of codes is available for each disease fund.)
- Patient's first and last name, social security number, date of birth, address, phone number, and email address if available
- Patient's health insurance carrier name and member ID
- Patient's income and number of people in the household
- Provider and facility's name, NPI, email, phone number, and address



## 4. Submit your patient's application

The application process takes just **7-10 minutes**.

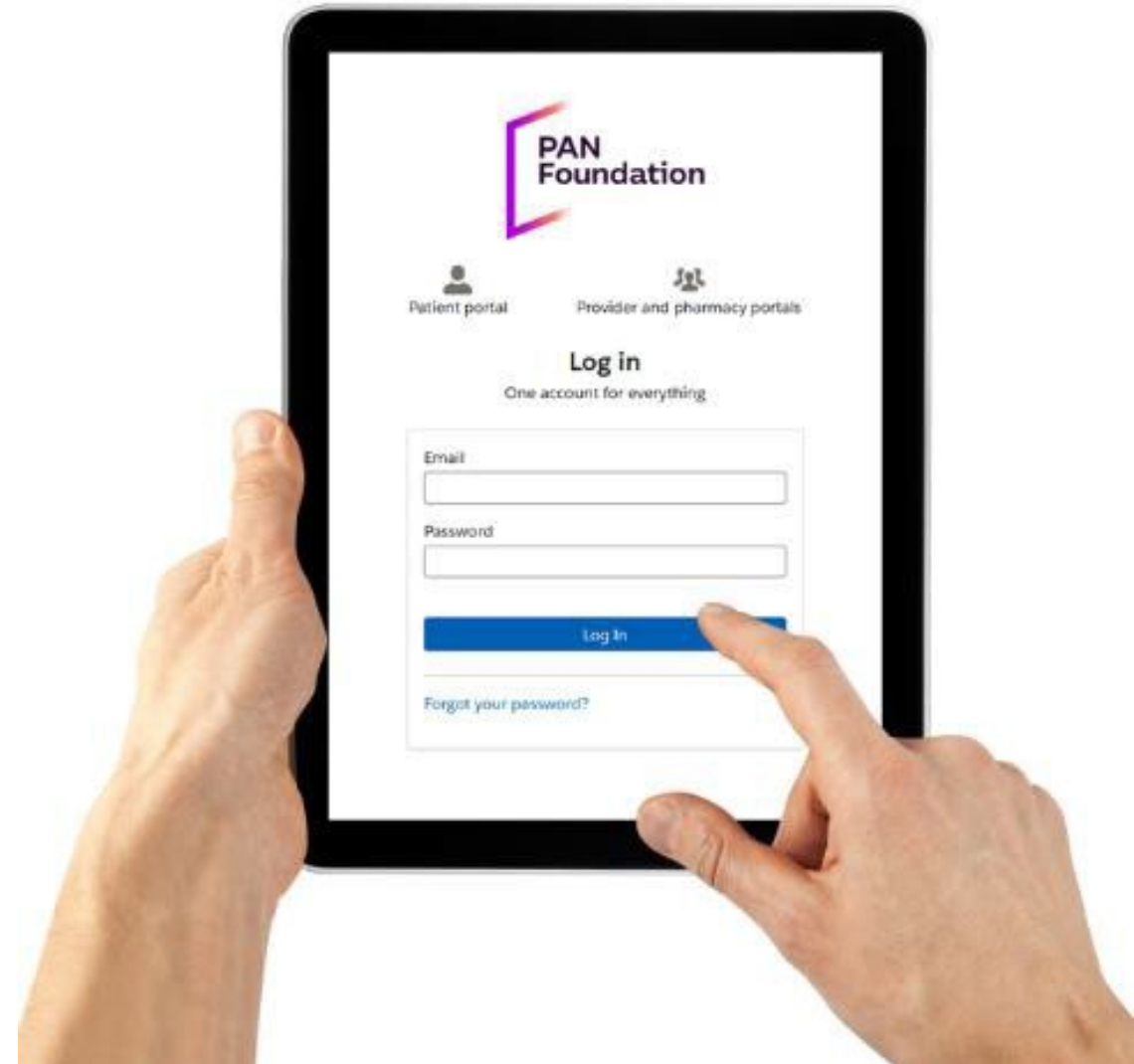

# What's in a Portal Account?

**You can log in to your PAN portal 24/7 to:**

- Apply for new PAN grants for your patients
- Apply for additional funding or renewal grants for your patients
- Check information like grant balances, eligibility dates, claims status, and medication coverage
- Submit claims
- Update contact information for yourself or your patients
- Sign up for a disease fund wait list to be notified when it opens
- Access important messages about grants, wait lists, and more
- Send secure messages to PAN support staff



# Create a New PAN Portal Account

## Sign up for a portal account in few easy steps:

1. Visit **panapply.org**. Bookmark the log in page for easy access.
2. At the bottom of the login screen, find and select **“Don’t have an account? Click here to register!”**
3. On the next screen, find the block for **Healthcare providers and pharmacies**. Click **‘Register now’** and complete the account registration screens. *Note: You will need your individual or organization National Provider Identifier (NPI) number.*

Register here if you're a healthcare professional and new to PAN



4. You'll receive a registration confirmation email. Log in to your portal account and update your password **within 24 hours**.

# Tips and Best Practices



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# Screening Patients

- Identify eligible patients early **during treatment initiation**, and again **if medications or insurance change**.
- Make sure **all care team members** are comfortable having financial screening conversations, not just navigators or case managers.
- Check for **additional eligible funds** when patients have multiple diagnoses (e.g., COPD, diabetes, and cancer).
- Don't forget about **transportation** and **premium assistance!**



# The PAN Portal

- **Create portal accounts early to avoid delays.**
  - Make it part of the onboarding process for new staff.
  - Ensure current portal users are logging in regularly to maintain access.
- Designate **at least two portal administrators** and ensure they know how to add new users and keep access lists up-to-date.
- Have at least one **“portal super user”** on your team who can coach others and help troubleshoot issues.
- Ask team members to sign up for portal trainings or refresher sessions when needed (email [bstuber@panfoundation.org](mailto:bstuber@panfoundation.org)).



# Wait Lists and Fund Openings

- **If a disease fund at PAN is closed**, make sure to add the patient to the wait list as soon as possible. *(And don't forget to **check FundFinder** for additional openings at other foundations.)*
- **Assign a staff member** to monitor PAN communications, emails, and portal alerts daily.
- **Create coverage plans** for vacation periods to prevent missed openings or deadlines.
- **If you do miss a deadline**, make sure to sign the patient up for wait list again (if the funds are still needed).

# FundFinder

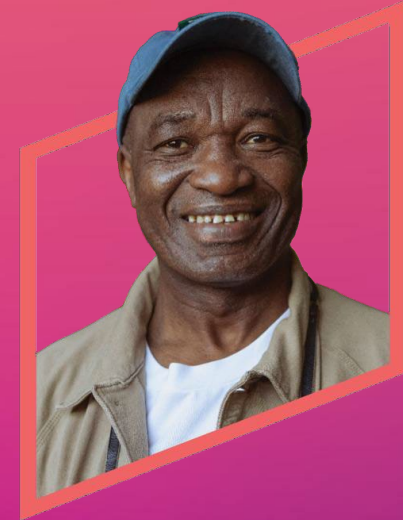
Tracking patient assistance funds in one convenient, free app

**FundFinder** is a free website and app that helps you track more than **200 patient assistance funds** across nine charitable organizations.

You can sign up for **email and text alerts** when a disease assistance fund you're interested in opens at PAN or other organizations.

## How to use FundFinder

1. Create a FundFinder account (visit **fundfinder.org**).
2. Find and follow funds of interest to see when your funds are opened or closed.
3. Get notifications when you follow a disease fund. FundFinder will send you email and text notifications each time a fund opens at one of the organizations listed.

Patients can apply for a PAN grant if they are: currently in treatment or taking medication for their diagnosis, or get treatment in the next 90 days, or scheduled to begin treatment in the next 120 days.

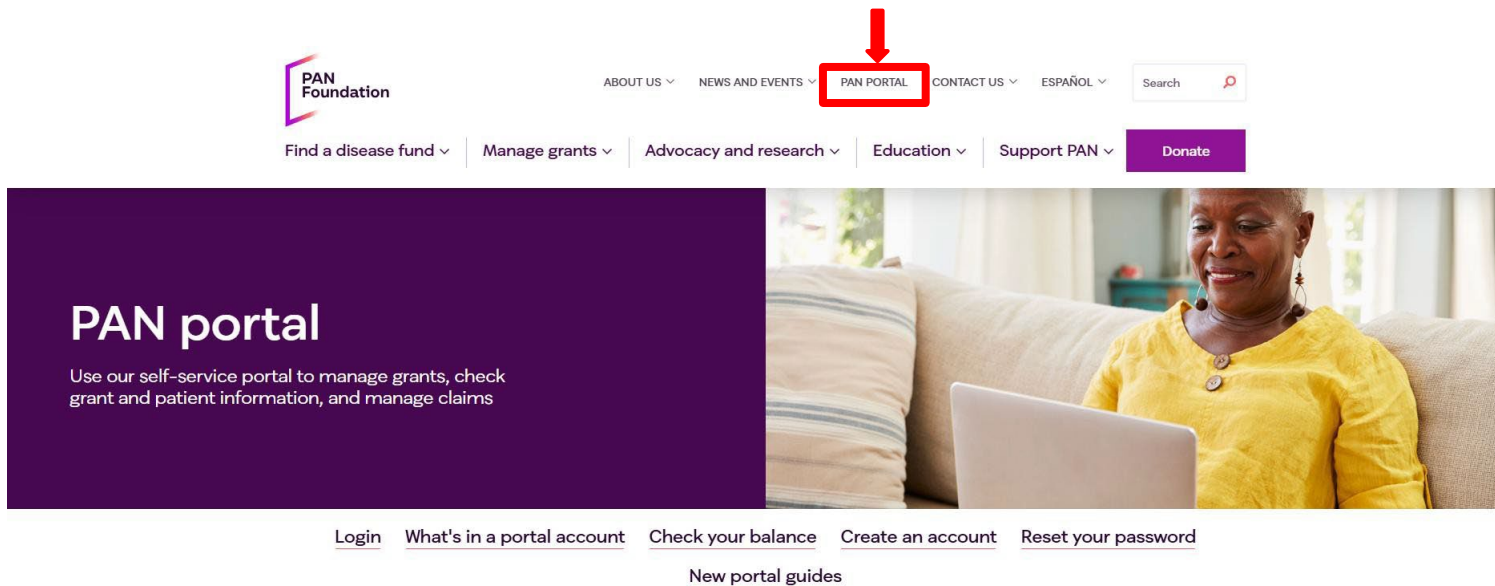
